

# SCIENTIFICALLY VERIFIABLE PROOF THAT GOD WROTE THE BIBLE

There are number patterns in the books, chapters, and verses in the Bible which cannot be explained by random chance. It is statistically impossible for them to be there by accident or coincidence. They had to be programmed into the text by an infinitely intelligent author. Here is just a small sample of the thousands of anomalies which have been found so far:

In the first two chapters of the Bible, God made heaven and earth, and all that is within them in 6 days, and rested on the 7th day. He then blessed and sanctified the 7th day, making it holy. This pattern of 7 goes throughout the entire Bible as God's number of rest, completion, and perfection.

In Genesis 1, God personally speaks 343 words (e.g. "Let there be light").  $343 = 7 \times 7 \times 7$ . In Matthew 1, God speaks a total of 49 words (through the angel of the Lord).  $49 = 7 \times 7$ . This creates a perfect "sevens" pattern in the first chapter of the Old Testament and

the first chapter of the New Testament.

**Genesis 1** =  $7 \times 7 \times 7$  words spoken by God

**Matthew 1** =  $7 \times 7$  words spoken by God

The Godhead - 1 John 5:7 **"For there are three that bear record in heaven, the Father, the Word, and the Holy Ghost: and these three are one."**

**The Father + The Word + Holy Ghost = 777**  
mentions in the Bible

**God + Jesus + Holy Spirit =  $(777 \times 3)$**  mentions in  
the New Testament

**God + Jesus + his Spirit =  $(777 \times 7)$**  mentions in the  
Bible

**God + Jesus + his Spirit =  $(777 \times 3)$**  mentions in the  
New Testament (his Spirit = case-sensitive)

**Holy One + Father + Son + Spirit = 777** mentions  
in the Bible - All capitalized, No endings

The entire Bible is summarized by Moses (representing the Old Testament) and Jesus Christ (representing the New Testament). John 1:17, which contains the 777th mention of Moses, says, **"For the law was given by Moses, but grace and truth came by Jesus Christ."** If you only look at the verse text (excluding Psalm inscriptions), the following pattern emerges:

**Moses(') =  $(777+70)$**  mentions

**Jesus(') + Christ('s) =  $(777+777)$**  mentions

**Moses(') + Jesus(') + Christ('s) =  $(7 \times 7 \times 7 \times 7)$**   
mentions

The Father and the Son - 1 John 4:14 **"And we have seen and do testify that the Father sent the Son to be the Saviour of the world."**

**Father + Son** =  $7 \times 7 \times 7$  mentions in the Gospels  
**Father + Son** =  $7 \times 7$  mentions in the first 7 Epistles  
**Father + Son** = 7 mentions in the 7th Epistle  
**Father + Son** = 77 mentions in the remaining 14 Epistles  
**Father + Son** =  $7 \times 7$  mentions in John's Epistles & Revelation  
**Father + Son** = 7 mentions in Revelation  
**Father + Son** =  $70 \times 7$  mentions in the Bible  
**Father** =  $7 \times 37$  mentions in the Bible  
**Son** =  $7 \times 33$  mentions in the Bible  
**Father + Son** =  $7 \times 7 \times 7$  verses in the first 12 books of the New Testament  
**Father + Son** =  $7 \times 7$  verses in the first 7 books after the Gospels

The name above all names is Jesus. There are a total of 980 mentions of Jesus(') referring to Jesus *Christ*. In the first and last chapters of the Old Testament (Genesis 1 and Malachi 4), there are a total of 980 words. Furthermore,  $980 = 70 \times 7 + 70 \times 7$ . It just so happens that Jesus speaks this exact equation in Matthew 18:22. In context, Peter is asking Jesus how many times to forgive a brother who sins against you. Miraculously, the name of Jesus appears perfectly separated into  $70 \times 7$  mentions in Odd Books (Matthew, Luke, Acts, 1 Corinthians, etc.) as well as  $70 \times 7$  mentions in Even Books (Mark, John, Romans, 2 Corinthians, etc.). Jesus is the only word amongst all heavily mentioned words in the New Testament where this type of balance occurs. It should not occur at all by chance, because there are far more chapters, verses, and words in Odd Books than in Even Books.

**All mentions of Jesus(') = 980 mentions =  $70 \times 7$   
+  $70 \times 7$**

**First and Last Chapters of the O.T. = 980 words**

**Odd Books of the N.T. =  $70 \times 7$  mentions of  
Jesus(')**

**Even Books of the N.T. =  $70 \times 7$  mentions of  
Jesus(')**

Jesus first appears as the 7th word from the beginning of the New Testament, and last appears as the 7th word from the end of the New Testament. He is the 77th from God the Father in Luke's genealogy (Luke 3:23-38) and first appears 77% of the way through the Bible (by total word count). Jesus speaks His signature phrase exactly 77 times (Verily I say unto you/thee...) and nobody else uses that phrase in the entire Bible. All mentions of Jesus Christ and Christ Jesus = 77 mentions in the first 7 books of the New Testament.

**Jesus = Word #7 from the beginning of the N.T.**

**Jesus = Word #7 from the end of the N.T.**

**Jesus = 77th from God the Father**

**Jesus = 77% through the Bible (Mat 1:1)**

**Jesus Christ + Christ Jesus = 77 mentions in the  
first 7 books of the N.T.**

**Jesus speaks His signature phrase 77 times.**

Jesus, who is the Lord of the sabbath (The 7th day-a holy day of rest), clearly demonstrates this in Matthew 11:28-12:8. The first mention of **rest** in the New Testament falls on verse 343 =  $(7 \times 7 \times 7)$  of the New Testament (Matthew 11:28), when Jesus offers rest to all who labour and are heavy laden. 7 verses later, Jesus draws a lesson (Matthew 12:4)

from the 7777th verse of the Bible (1 Samuel 21:4) for the Pharisees who are accusing His disciples of being unlawful on the sabbath. Matthew 12:1 is the first time that sabbath occurs in the New Testament, and the 77th in the entire Bible (excluding Psalm headings). Also, scripture records exactly 7 miracles performed by Jesus on the sabbath day.

The first and last verses of the Bible have the exact same amount of letters (44), consonants (27), and vowels (17).

The numbers 17 and 27 first appear as directly related to each other in scripture, as the first and last days of the waters of the flood of Noah (Genesis 7:11, 8:14).

The first verse of the Bible to have "**seven**" by itself in the text is Genesis 5:7, which contains, 7×4 vowels, 7×7 consonants, and 77 letters. It is the first verse of the Bible to have 77 letters.

The last word of Revelation, **Amen** (capitalized), is mentioned 77 times in the Bible. The first word of Genesis, **In**, and the last word of Revelation, **Amen**, are mentioned a combined 777 times in Genesis and Revelation.

The Bible contains a total of 31,102 verses. The middle verses are Psalm 103:1,2 which have the same digits (103:1-2 → 31102). The most interesting fact about 31,102 is its mathematical connection to 7777.

$$31,102 = 7774 + 7775 + 7776 + 7777$$

There are no other ways to add up to 31,102 using consecutive numbers.
