A new Gospel tract, available on <u>pocketgospeltracts.com</u>, lists a series of proofs, showing a small percentage of research that has been done to determine whether God has placed his seal of approval on the most printed and influential book in world history: the King James Bible.

The purpose of this article is to verify the information on this tract. We will cover every single part of it. All searches are verified by King James Pure Bible Search, the most reliable & accurate Bible search software exclusively made for the King James Bible. There are number patterns in the books, chapters, and verses in the Bible which cannot be explained by random chance. It is statistically impossible for them to be there by accident or coincidence. They had to be programmed into the text by an infinitely intelligent author. Here is just a small sample of the thousands of anomalies which have been found so far:

In the first two chapters of the Bible, God made heaven and earth, and all that is within them in 6 days, and rested on the 7th day. He then blessed and sanctified the 7th day, making it holy. This pattern of 7 goes throughout the entire Bible as God's number of rest, completion, and perfection.

In Genesis 1, God personally speaks 343 (e.g. "Let there be light"). $343 = 7 \times 7 \times 7$. In Matthew 1, God speaks a total of 49 words (through the angel of the Lord). $49 = 7 \times 7$. This creates a perfect "sevened" pattern in the first chapter of the Old Testament and the first chapter of the New Testament.

Day 7 = 0 words

Genesis 1:3 = 4 words ("Let there be light")

Genesis 1:6 = 20 words ("Let there be a firmament in the midst of the waters, and let it divide the waters from the waters")

Genesis 1:9 = 18 words ("Let the waters under the heaven be gathered together unto one place, and let the dry land appear")

Genesis 1:11 = 27 words ("Let the earth bring forth grass, the herb yielding seed, and the fruit tree yielding fruit after his kind, whose seed is in itself, upon the earth")

Genesis 1:14-15 = 49 words ("Let there be lights in the firmament of the heaven to divide the day from the night; and let them be for signs, and for seasons, and for days, and years: And let them be for lights in the firmament of the heaven to give light upon the earth")

Genesis 1:20 = 26 words ("Let the waters bring forth abundantly the moving creature that hath life, and fowl that may fly above the earth in the open firmament of heaven")

Genesis 1:22 = 18 words ("Be fruitful, and multiply, and fill the waters in the seas, and let fowl multiply in the earth")

Genesis 1:24 = 23 words ("Let the earth bring forth the living creature after his kind, cattle, and creeping thing, and beast of the earth after his kind")

Genesis 1:26 = 47 words ("Let us make man in our image, after our likeness: and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth")

Genesis 1:28 = 37 words ("Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth, and subdue it: and have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over every living thing that moveth upon the earth")

Genesis 1:29-30 = 74 words ("Behold, I have given you every herb bearing seed, which is upon the face of all the earth, and every tree, in the which is the fruit of a tree yielding seed; to you it shall be for meat. And to every beast of the earth, and to every fowl of the air, and to every thing that creepeth upon the earth, wherein there is life, I have given every green herb for meat")

In Matthew 1, the first chapter of the New Testament, the Lord speaks exactly 7×7 words to Joseph, and doesn't speak anywhere else in the chapter. Total words spoken by God in Matthew 1 = 49 words $= 7 \times 7$ words

Matthew 1:20-21 = 49 words ("Joseph, thou son of David, fear not to take unto thee Mary thy wife: for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Ghost. And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name JESUS: for he shall save his people from their sins.")


Note: This passage is spoken by the angel of the Lord, who speaks the personal words of God as seen throughout all scripture. E.g. Genesis 22:15-16 – And the angel of the LORD called unto Abraham out of heaven the second time, And said, By myself have I sworn, saith the LORD...

Therefore, the complete pattern is 100% verified.

It should also be noted that the 4th day of creation also contains 7×7 words. This matches with the New Testament opening with 7×7 words.

Total words spoken by God in all 7 days of creation = $7 \times 7 \times 7 = 7^3$ Total words spoken by God on Day 4 of creation = $7 \times 7 = 7^2$ Total words spoken by God in Matthew 1 = $7 \times 7 = 7^2$

The Lord Jesus Christ who was the Word (John 1:1) became flesh (John 1:14) on Day 4 (Year 4000) of God's prophetic timeline. (2 Peter 3:8). Here is 3D visualization of this pattern:












THE TRACT READS... [CONT.]

The entire Bible is summarized by Moses (representing the Old Testament) and Jesus Christ (representing the New Testament). John 1:17, which contains the 777th mention of Moses, says, "For the law was given by Moses, but grace and truth came by Jesus Christ." If you only look at the verse text (excluding Psalm inscriptions), the following pattern emerges:

Moses(') = (777+70) mentions Jesus(') + Christ('s) = (777+777) mentions Moses(') + Jesus(') + Christ('s) = $(7 \times 7 \times 7 \times 7)$ mentions

FACT CHECK John 1:17... contains the 777th mention of Moses





Note: this pattern is possible in two different ways. This is the simple method (above), but the more exact way - all forms of **Jesus*** and **Christ*** excluding antimentions- is possible by excluding the 3 antimentions of **Jesus** (Joshua/Justus in Acts 7:45, Colossians 4:11, Hebrews 4:8) and including the 3 mentions of **Christian(s)**. The 3 antimentions of **Jesus** and 3 mentions of **Christian(s)** offset each other to produce the same sum.





True. This is a more elaborate pattern that omits all "antimentions" as outlined in red in the screenshot below. A simple example of an antimention is when the rich man in hell says "<u>Father</u> Abraham, have mercy on me..." in Luke 16:24, but the "**Father**" of this passage is not referring to <u>God</u>. Rather it is <u>Abraham</u>. Thus, the antimention of "**Father**" in Luke 16:24 is excluded/omitted from the total count. That is the only antimention of **Father** (Capitalized, singular) in the Bible. There are 66 antimentions of **Son** (Capitalized, singular), 61 in Ezekiel, and 5 in the Gospels. Here is the breakdown:

Father = 179 mentions (excluding antimentions) in the Gospels **Son** = 164 mentions (excluding antimentions) in the Gospels

Total mentions $(179 + 164) = 343 = 7 \times 7 \times 7$


There are no antimentions of Father or Son in the Epistles & Revelation. All singular, capitalized mentions of **Father** and **Son** are referring to God and Jesus in these books. Here is the breakdown:











True. There are 66 antimentions of **Son** (Capitalized, singular), 61 in Ezekiel, and 5 in the Gospels. There is 1 antimention of **Father**. Here is the breakdown:

Father = 259 mentions (excluding antimentions) = 7×37 **Son** = 231 mentions (excluding antimentions) = 7×33

Total mentions $(259 + 231) = 490 = 70 \times 7$



True. Again, these searches omit antimentions (detailed above). Instead of looking at how many times a word is mentioned, this method looks at how many verses that **Father** and **Son** are found in. If there are two or more mentions of Father and Son in one verse, it still only counts as one verse. Here is the breakdown:







The name above all names is Jesus.

There are a total of 980 mentions of Jesus(') referring to Jesus Christ. In the first and last chapters of the Old Testament (Genesis 1 and Malachi 4), there are a total of 980 words. Furthermore, $980 = 70 \times 7 + 70 \times 7$. It just so happens that Jesus speaks this exact equation in Matthew 18:22. In context, Peter is asking Jesus how many times to forgive a brother who sins against you. Miraculously, the name of Jesus appears perfectly separated into 70×7 mentions in Odd Books (Matthew, Luke, Acts, 1 Corinthians, etc.) as well as 70×7 mentions in Even Books (Mark, John, Romans, 2 Corinthians, etc.).



True. In total, there are 983 mentions of Jesus (or Jesus') if you're not counting Bar-jesus in Acts 13:6. Out of those 983 mentions, 3 of them are not referring to Jesus Christ (Acts 7:45, Colossians 4:11, Hebrews 4:8), leaving a total of 980 mentions of Jesus(') in the King James Bible. The search program Pure Bible Search (pictured below) does not count "Bar-jesus" by default, and so it gives 983 mentions before excluding the 3 antimentions.





That's it. No other word mentioned 77+ times appears the same amount of times in both Odd and Even books of the New Testament.

FACT CHECK Jesus speaks His signature phrase exactly 77 times (Verily I say unto you/thee...)

True. Jesus is in fact the only one in the Bible to use this phrase "Verily I say unto you/thee...". It is uniquely his own, and he indeed says it exactly 77 times in 77 verses.

While the tract is missing a small technicality, it is true that the first 7 books of the New Testament (Matthew to 1 Corinthians) contain exactly 77 mentions of **Jesus Christ & Christ Jesus** with "Jesus Christ" mentioned in the first verse (Matthew 1:1) and "Christ Jesus" mentioned in the last verse (1 Corinthians 16:24).







Jesus, who is the Lord of the sabbath (The 7th day- a holy day of rest), clearly demonstrates this in Matthew 11:28-12:8. The first mention of rest in the New Testament falls on verse $343 = (7 \times 7 \times 7)$ of the New Testament (Matthew 11:28), when Jesus offers rest to all who labour and are heavy laden. 7 verses later, Jesus draws a lesson (Matthew 12:4) from the 7777th verse of the Bible (1 Samuel 21:4) for the Pharisees who are accusing His disciples of being unlawful on the sabbath. Matthew 12:1 is the first time that sabbath occurs in the New Testament, and the 77th in the entire Bible (excluding Psalm headings). Also, scripture records exactly 7 miracles performed by Jesus on the sabbath day.

FACT CHECK The first mention of rest in the New Testament falls on verse $343 = (7 \times 7 \times 7)$ of the New Testament (Matthew 11:28)

True. The 343rd verse of the New Testament is also the first verse to mention "**rest**" in the N.T. $343 = 7^3 = 7 \times 7 \times 7$




FACT CHECK Jesus draws a lesson (Matthew 12:4) from the 7777th verse of the Bible (1 Samuel 21:4) for the Pharisees who are accusing His disciples of being unlawful on the sabbath

True. The first passage about the sabbath in the New Testament is where Jesus reproves the Pharisees with the 7777th verse of the Bible.


Matthew 12:1-4 At that time Jesus went **on the sabbath day** through the corn; and his disciples were an hungred, and began to pluck the ears of corn, and to eat. But when the Pharisees saw it, they said unto him, Behold, thy disciples do that which is not lawful to do **upon the sabbath day**. But he said unto them, <u>Have ye not read what David did</u>, when he was an hungred, and they that were with him; <u>How he entered into the house of God</u>, and did eat the shewbread, which was not lawful for him to eat, neither for them which were with him, but only for the priests?

The 7777th verse of the Bible: And the priest answered David, and said. There is no common bread under mine hand, but there is hallowed bread; if the young men have kept themselves at least from women. – 1 Samuel 21:4



FACT CHECK Matthew 12:1 is the first time that sabbath occurs in the New Testament, and the 77th in the entire Bible (excluding Psalm headings)

True. The first mention of "**sabbath**" in the New Testament is the 77th in the Bible when you exclude Psalm superscriptions.



FACT CHECK ...scripture records exactly 7 miracles performed by Jesus on the sabbath day

True. In total, there are 49 miracles of Jesus detailed in the gospels. Out of those 49, 7 of them are performed on the sabbath day. Here is a complete table of the 49 miracles performed by Jesus is the Gospels:

Footnotes: This list covers all miracles of Jesus as they are detailed in the four gospels. Each miracle is listed in the chronological order in which it took place in the history of Christ's ministry. By no means is this list representative of all the miracles performed by Jesus– as stated in John 20:30, "And many other signs truly did Jesus in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book:"

There are also a few instances in the gospels mentioning Jesus' miracles within a general summarization of events, but not a specific account (such as Matthew 4:23-24, 9:35, 12:27-28, 13:54, 14:2, Mark 1:39, 6:2,14, Luke 5:15, 11:19-20, 13:32, 23:8, John 2:23, 3:2, 4:45, 6:2, 7:3,31, 10:25,32,37,38, 11:37,47, 12:37, 14:10,12, 15:24, 20:30, 21:25), and thus it is not counted as a miracle that occurs in a specific place and time.

The account in Luke 10 with the 70 disciples healing and casting out devils in Jesus' name was not included, even though the account of the 12 disciples given power in Luke 9 was included. This is because the accounts of the 12 disciples given power has it worded a lot differently. In those accounts (of power given to the 12), the scripture specifically states that Jesus gave them power. That's a supernatural claim that is not explicitly made in the scripture with the account of the 70. (Luke 10:19 has Jesus making a similar statement, but it takes place after the events already unfolded - see Luke 10:17 - and is not a claim of him actively performing a miracle, but rather His summarization of the gift that he gave them.) And while it probably happened in the same fashion, it has to be assumed, and therefore is not based on any verse of scripture. So to clarify, the miracles themselves- of healing, raising the dead, casting out devils- are not considered miracles performed by Jesus (since His disciples performed them), but rather the miracle of Jesus in Matthew 10:1, Mark 6:7, & Luke 9:1, is that He gave his disciples power to do these things.

Events such as the transfiguration and resurrection are also not included for several reasons. The transfiguration in Matthew 17:1-8, Mark 9:2-8, Luke 9:28-36 does not say anywhere whether it was Jesus or the Father or the Holy Ghost performing anything. It is rather described as "he was transfigured..." which doesn't give us any certainty of who exactly "did" this thing. While we can all reasonably agree that Jesus is God and played a role in it, we are once again standing on assumptions rather than scripture itself. When we let the scriptures have all the authority, we must kneel to the fact that God's word is silent on this, and therefore we cannot with 100% certainty claim it to be something triggered by an act or command of Jesus.

The resurrection was not included for the same reason as the above two: the scriptures are simply silent and do not give a detailed account of the actual resurrection event.


The numbers 17 and 27 first appear as directly related to each other in scripture, as the first and last days of the waters of the flood of Noah (Genesis 7:11, 8:14).

The first verse of the Bible to have "**seven**" by itself in the text is Genesis 5:7, which contains, 7×4 vowels, 7×7 consonants, and 77 letters. It is the first verse of the Bible to have 77 letters.

FACT CHECK The first and last verses of the Bible have the exact same amount of letters (44), consonants (27), and vowels (17)

True. The first verse of the Bible (Genesis 1:1) has 44 letters, 17 vowels, and 27 consonants. The last verse of the Bible (Revelation 22:21) has 44 letters, 17 vowels, and 27 consonants.

No other verse in the entire book of Revelation has exactly 44 letters. No verse in the Epistles of Jude, 1-2-3 John, 1-2 Peter, or James has any verse with 44 letters. You have to go all the way back to the book of Hebrews to find the next closest verse with 44 letters (Hebrews 10:17). Of the 1533 verses in Genesis, only 13 of them are made up of 44 letters.



FACT CHECK The numbers 17 and 27 first appear as directly related to each other in scripture, as the first and last days of the waters of the flood of Noah (Genesis 7:11, 8:14)

True. No other forms of the number 17* exist in scripture before Genesis 7:11. No other forms of 27* exist before Genesis 8:14.

Genesis 7:11 – In the six hundredth year of Noah's life, in the second month, the **seventeenth** day of the month, the same day were all the fountains of the great deep broken up, and the windows of heaven were opened.

Genesis 8:14 - And in the second month, on the seven and twentieth day of the month, was the earth dried.

Both numbers work together to detail the absolute beginning and absolute ending of the flood of Noah.

FACT CHECK The first verse of the Bible to have "seven" by itself in the text is Genesis 5:7, which contains, 7×4 vowels, 7×7 consonants, and 77 letters. It is the first verse of the Bible to have 77 letters

True. This is not the first appearance of seven* (e.g. seventh / sevenfold / etc.) but is rather the first hard mention of "seven" (with no endings).

Genesis 5:7 = 77 letters / 49 consonants / 28 vowels

And Seth lived after he begat Enos eight hundred and seven years, and begat sons and daughters:

None of the 112 verses before Genesis 5:7 contain exactly 77 letters.


THE TRACT READS... [CONT.]

The last word of Revelation, **Amen** (capitalized), is mentioned 77 times in the Bible. The first word of Genesis, **In**, and the last word of Revelation, **Amen**, are mentioned a combined 777 times in Genesis and Revelation.






